



DEUTSCHE BANK CELEBRATES GRAND OPENING OF NEW TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CENTER IN CARY

Governor Bev Perdue, Cary Mayor Harold Weinbrecht & Deutsche Bank Officials Preside Over Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

Cary, NC - December 14, 2009 - Deutsche Bank, in conjunction with the State of North Carolina and the Town of Cary, marked the grand opening of a new technology development center in Cary today. The facility, located at 3000 Centre Green Way, will operate as DB Global Technology (DBGT), a newly formed subsidiary, and will develop a range of leading-edge applications and software solutions for many of Deutsche Bank's businesses. The Bank expects to create more than 300 full-time jobs at the facility within the next five years and will draw from information technology professionals in the Raleigh-Durham area in addition to graduates from local universities. The facility will be run by John Eagleson, Chief Operating Officer of DBGT Cary.

"We are extremely excited to open this new high-tech facility in the Research Triangle area, which is known for attracting top IT professionals and students and home to many other leading technology companies," said Ashton-Rigby.
